### **INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM (IAP)**

The Individual Achievement Program (IAP) is a remedial instructional program designed to provide additional services to students in grades kindergarten through 12. Through the program, instructors teach strategies and skills that assist students in achieving the objectives of the district's curriculum.

At the kindergarten through fourth grade level, the program shall primarily target students with achievement deficits in literacy. At the fifth through 12<sup>th</sup> grade level, it shall target students who meet the state's definition of children at risk and students who demonstrate deficits in academic achievement as indicated through the Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Examination, curriculum-based data and/or the Teacher Helping Teacher (THT) or Monona Assistance Team (MAT) process.

The Monona Grove School District shall not discriminate in individual achievement programs on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, age, homeless status, handicap or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability.
