### **RANK IN CLASS TIE BREAKING PROCEDURES FOR THE WISCONSIN ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP**

If a tie exists based upon grade point average for the designation of academic scholar for the purposes of the Wisconsin Academic Excellence Higher Education Scholarship in the Monona Grove School District, the following criteria will be used to break the tie in order to name the scholar(s) and prioritize the remaining students as alternates:

1. The student must plan to attend a Wisconsin college or university.
2. The student with the highest score on the American College Test (ACT) by the end of the seventh semester shall be named the scholar. If any of the students involved have taken the exam more than once, the highest composite score received, prior to the end of the seventh semester will be used.
3. In case there is still a tie, if both students have taken the SAT I test, then the student with the highest score on the SAT I is the scholar.
4. If a tie continues, the student who has taken the greatest number of advanced placement courses shall be named the scholar.
5. If a tie continues, the student who has the greatest number of credits earned through the seventh semester shall be named the scholar.
6. If a tie continues, a chance drawing shall break the tie. The Monona Grove School District School Board President will draw a name in the presence of the Superintendent and two other School Board members. The first name drawn will be the student who is named the scholar. The remaining student names will be drawn by the Monona Grove School District Board President to rank the alternates.
